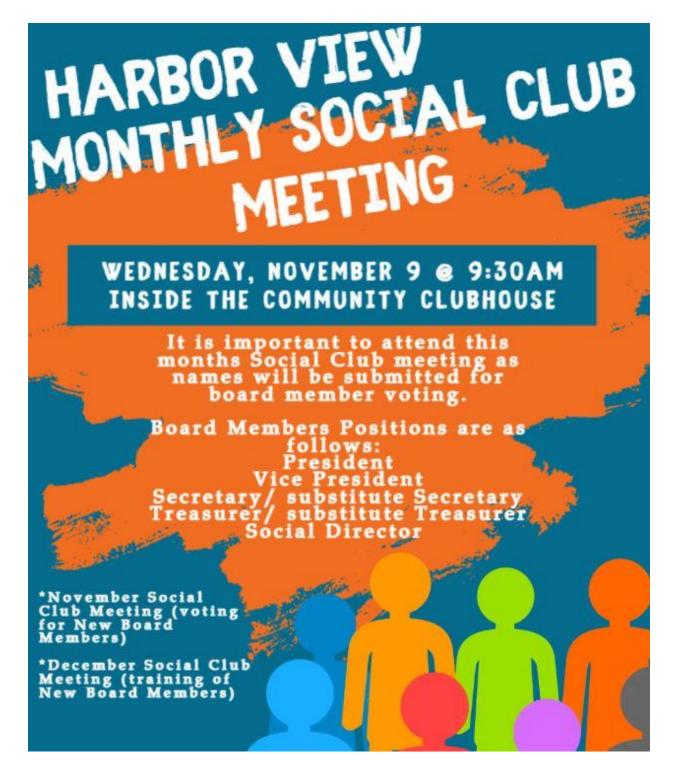

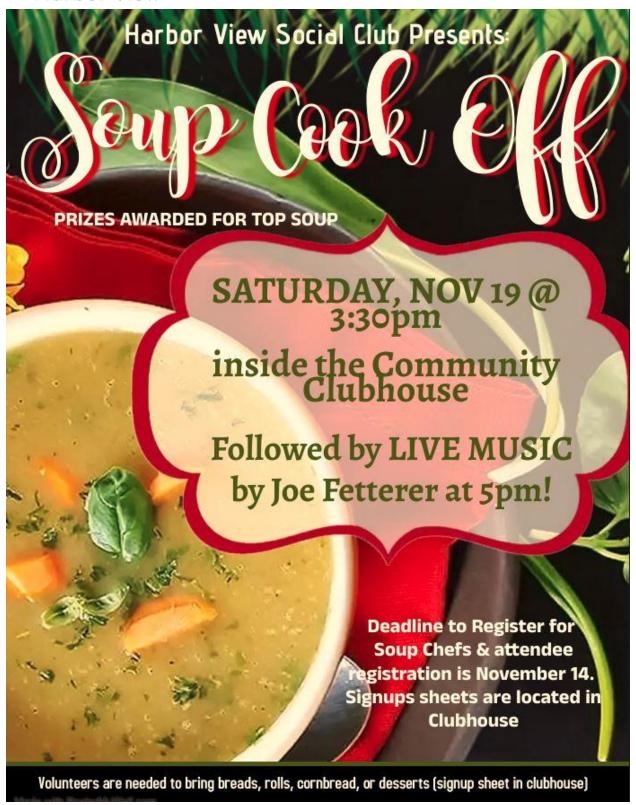

MANAGER'S CORNER

Greetings Harbor View Residents!

Fall is here which means the return of our Seasonal residents to their homes here at Harbor View on the Bay. We are so excited to see everyone returning and look forward to a fun filled month of activities! As a reminder when arriving back to the Community, please check in with the Community Office to let us know of your return. We appreciate your cooperation Θ

We are going to continue each month of 2022 to focus on a particular part of the Harbor View Prospectus that everyone in the community should review and abide by.

Our Prospectus focus for NOVEMBER is for <u>everyone</u> to read and understand "Standards for Homes & Home Sites".

(Community Rules & Regulations, Page 51)

COMMUNITY STANDARDS FOR HOMES AND HOME SITES:

All mobile homes must be kept in good repair, including utility buildings. Home owners must immediately repair any water leaks water lines from the shut-off valve to the mobile home and in or from pipes or fixtures in, on or under the mobile home. Broken windows, peeling paint, dull exterior of a mobile home, dirt, grime, or mildew visible from a community roadway or an adjacent lot must be corrected. The exterior surfaces of the mobile home including the eaves and trim shall be kept free of mildew or discoloration. Mobile homes must be washed at least annually. Peeling, fading, or damaged exterior surfaces must be restored to the condition of a well-maintained home in the Community. Changes from the original material and color of a screened area must be approved by the Community Manager prior to installation. All exterior materials used in upgrading must be approved in writing by the Community Manager prior to their use on the home. The materials used must be consistent with the types of materials used on well-maintained homes in the Community. Upon failure of Home Owner to take appropriate corrective action after receipt of notice, Community Management may, but has no obligation to, have the necessary work performed.



Our Community focus for November is for everyone to understand and abide by rules for Guest Policy (Community Rules & Regulations, Page 42)

GUEST POLICY-

GUESTS. All persons who are not registered with Community Management as approved occupants of a mobile home within the Community and who are transient occupants of a mobile home on Community lot at the invitation of the mobile home owners thereof, are defined as guests. Guests who intend to stay in the Community for a period in excess of 24 hours must register with Community Management as soon as possible after arrival in the Community. Guests shall not stay in the Community more than fifteen (15) consecutive days or 30 total days in any year without written permission from Community Management. Guests staying with a mobile home owner for more than fifteen (15) consecutive days or thirty (30) days per year must be forty (45) years of age or older. Any guest staying with a mobile home owner in excess of thirty (30) consecutive days shall be considered an applicant for permanent residency in the Community, and shall be subject to the Community Rules and Regulations, including but not limited to the obligation to make application for residency and satisfy the Rules of Entry. Home Owners shall be solely responsible for the conduct of their guests. The head of each family shall be continually responsible for the actions of his or her own children, guests and their guests' children, making full restitution for any damages occurring to another resident's property or that of the Community Owner's property. All guests must comply with the Community rules and regulations. Guests shall not be permitted to reside or stay in the Community in the absence of the Resident. Seasonal occupants are requested to notify the Community Manager of the period during which the mobile home is vacant. Guests must be signed in and out upon arrival in the Community. Guests will not be allowed to bring a dog or any other animal into the Community with them at any time, even for a daily visit. Seeing eye dogs are permitted for the sight impaired. Any guest staying with a resident in excess of fifteen (15) consecutive days or thirty (30) total days per year shall be considered an applicant for permanent residency in the Community, and shall be subject to the Community rules and regulations, including but not limited to the obligation to make application for residency and to satisfy the rules and regulations of entry. If Community Management, in its sole discretion, determines that a guest has violated a requirement or provision set forth in these rules and regulations, and in response to such violation Community Management so requests, a guest must vacate the Community within 24 hours of delivery to the home owner or to the guest of a written demand to vacate. Roomers are not guests; roomers are not allowed.



What is a Community?

- 1. A group of people living in the same place or having a particular characteristic in common.
- 2. A feeling of fellowship with others as a result of sharing common attitudes, interest and goals.
