





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### MANAGER'S CORNER

Greetings Harbor View Residents,

The Fall season is officially here which means that many of our Snowbirds will be returning to their homes here at Harbor View on the Bay. We look forward to everyone returning and to another fun filled month of activities including the return of BINGO and the Harbor View Social Club Halloween bash! As a reminder when arriving back to the Community, please check in with the Community Office to let us know of your return. We appreciate your cooperation

We are excited for the start of the Amenity project at Sunset Point. We ask that you please use extra CAUTION when driving or biking around the back side of Manatee Loop near the construction area. We also want to remind everyone that this area is a Construction Zone and NOONE should be entering the fenced area at any time day or night.

We are going to continue to provide residents with monthly reminders based on the Harbor View on the Bay Prospectus/Community Rules & Regulations. We ask that if you have any questions about any of these, that you contact the Community Office for clarification.

A hard copy of the Prospectus and Community Rules & Regulations can be found inside of a binder at the Community Clubhouse library. We ask that you please do not remove the binder from the library.

#### **CHILDREN**

- 1. For the purpose of these Rules, all persons under twenty-one (21) years of age are classified as children.
- 2. Children are welcome at Harbor View. Mobile home owners are financially responsible for any damage to Community or private property caused by their juvenile guests.
- 3. Children are welcome to visit up to fifteen (15) consecutive days or thirty (30) days per calendar year, provided the mobile home owner is present.



- 4. Children must confine their activities to the home of the mobile home owner they are visiting and must be accompanied by the mobile home owner in all other areas of the Community. **Positively no playing in the streets.**
- 5. Children are not permitted to take part in activities such as card games, bingo, and dances unless accompanied by a mobile home owner and at such times as no older persons are waiting to play.

### PARKING/VEHICLES

Residents must park their vehicles on their own lot unless prior written approval for an additional vehicle is obtained from Community Management, in Community Management's sole discretion. The Resident is permitted a total of two (2) vehicles per lot, provided there is adequate room on the driveway. Without prior written consent of Community Owner, no vehicle shall be parked in or on Community common areas, other than those areas specifically designated for parking. Except for loading and unloading, all boats, utility trailers, etc. must be not be parked in the Community. No overnight Recreation Vehicle Parking is allowed. All vehicles must have liability insurance in the minimum amount required by Florida law. As a security measure, all automobile doors should be locked. The street right-of-way may not be used for parking except for GUESTS, provided they do not remain more than five (5) hours. Cars are not to be parked on the lawns for any reason. In the event there is not sufficient space, it is the responsibility of the Resident to locate parking or storage outside the Community lot and not on other residents' lots. Parking on roadways within the Community or on lawns, swales, green areas or vacant lots or on undeveloped portions of the Community is strictly prohibited. Vehicles are not to be parked on the grass at any time. Only vehicles licensed and used for daily personal transportation will be allowed to be stored in the Community. All other vehicles, including but not limited to utility trailers of any type, boat trailers or any similar vehicles, must be removed from the lot. Community Management will ban from the Community any vehicles which, in its sole judgment, interfere with the peace, privacy, and/or general welfare of other residents or with the appearance of the Community. Vehicles in violation of these rules and regulations may be towed away without notice at Home Owner's expense, payable to the towing service and not to the Community Owner. Residents are responsible for their guests' vehicles.
