



MANAGER'S CORNER

Greetings Harbor View Residents,

It is hard to believe it's already September and we are approaching 1 year since Hurricane Ian. I have tried to put words on paper multiple times over the past week about where we were 1 year ago vs where we are today. I think back to the devastation that was brought to our small community but even more to the overall area and how we were all affected one way or another big or small. I remember Bobby and I leaving Venice the morning following Hurricane Ian to try and make our way back to the park. We were both very quiet and emotional most of the drive back seeing the devastation all around us everywhere we looked and what we may be going back when we arrive at Harborview. After what seemed to be the longest drive of my life, we arrived back to the park to find a lot of destruction, however, we were so thankful to see that our community was still there and that the waters did not take our little piece of heaven.

The next few days following Ian were days that none of us will forget... from the amount of what seemed to be endless debris, damaged homes, no internet, no phones, no electric, no water. However, the residents of Harborview all came together and helped each other in so many ways. We cleaned together, we cried together, we charged phones together, we grilled together, we hugged together... we became what we should be every day... a "COMMUNITY" ♥

We are going to continue to provide residents with monthly reminders based on the Harbor View on the Bay Prospectus/Community Rules & Regulations. We ask that if you have any questions about any of these, that you contact the Community Office for clarification.

A hard copy of the Prospectus and Community Rules & Regulations can be found inside of a binder at the Community Clubhouse library. We ask that you please do not remove the binder from the library.

Harbor View

1. PARKING:

There is no parking allowed, whatsoever, for any length of time, on any areas other than the driveway or, in some instances, the street. <u>Street parking is allowed for up to 5 hours by guests</u>. Please keep in mind that guests do not double park (side by side) in the street so that we can get emergency vehicles through. Please do not park within 30 ft of a curve or intersection so we have clear views of traffic

2. GUESTS:

All guests staying overnight MUST BE registered with the office. It's a short and simple form with no fees. As a reminder, guests are allowed to stay up to 2 weeks at a time or up to 30 calendar days per year. Please refer to rules and regulations for more details on guest policy.

3. STOP SIGNS/SPEEDING:

Speeding in excess of posted limits is prohibited. All autos, motor-cycles, mopeds, bicycles, and any other vehicle must observe the posted speed limits of ten (10) miles per hour and obey all "stop signs" or other posted warnings. <u>A FULL STOP must be made at all stop signs</u>. <u>THIS INCLUDES THE STOP SIGNS AT THE ENTRANCE OF</u> <u>THE COMMUNITY!!</u> All of these rules and regulations will be enforced as this is for the safety of our community residents. Residents must inform all of their guests and visitors about the speed limit and the aforementioned rules and regulations.

SNOW BIRD REMINDER: When arriving back to the Community, please check in with the Community Office to let us know of your return. We appreciate your cooperation 😂
